### **If a baby has a HEARING LOSS, the next steps are:**

- Referral to Early Intervention  
(Part C) 503-947-5738
- Contact Oregon Families for Hands  
& Voices 503-802-5301
- Evaluation by an ENT  
(Ear, Nose and Throat doctor)
- Learn about communication  
options and programs
- Discuss the use of hearing aids with  
a pediatric audiologist, including  
information on loaner hearing aids
- Learn about assistive listening  
devices (such as FM systems,  
cochlear implants, etc.)



- ☞ Schedule a rescreen at a screening facility or your birth hospital if your baby did not pass or missed the first screening.
- ☞ Schedule an appointment with a pediatric audiologist right away if your baby did not pass the rescreen.
- ☞ Be sure your doctor gets the results of all your tests.
