3. Recognize the relationship of the clinical subtypes to the gestational age and level of peak total bilirubin
4. Determine whether Auditory Neuropathy/Dys-synchrony (ANAD) was due to excessive newborn jaundice (Excessive hyperbilirubinemia)
5. Diagnose non-audiological neurological conditions that result from excessive newborn hyperbilirubinemia
6. Diagnose Auditory Neuropathy from a combination of emissions, ABR and reflexes
7. Develop a management program for the families and the patients that will lead to the outcome that the family desires
