#### **Abstract guidelines:**

Abstract submissions should contain

- Title
- Brief description of program, initiative or study including objective, methods of study and findings (maximum of 300 words).
- Information about the author(s).

#### **Poster guidelines:**

- One standard size foam board (40" x 36") will be provided.
- Posters will be displayed on easels which will also be provided.
- Push pins will be provided.
- Only authors who have registered for the conference are eligible to display a poster.

Poster sessions will be held: 10:30am – 11:00am (morning break)

3:00pm – 3:15pm (afternoon break)

Prior to 10am on day of seminar

**Poster removal**: After 3:30pm and before 5pm on day of seminar

**Reviewing and Scoring**:

Abstracts will be reviewed and scored according to the following criteria by a committee appointed by the RIHAP seminar planning committee:

1. Relevance/significance to hearing loss (1-10 points)
2. General interest to attendees (1-5 points)

3. Innovation/originality of work (1-5 points) 4. Overall clarity (1-5 points)
