Participants will be able to summarize the process from referral to services, describe appropriate services for a young child with hearing impairment, understand audiologic test results and their significance regarding a child's access to sound, identify and give examples of resources available to work with young children with hearing impairment, discuss services included in individual sessions and small group instruction and navigate the transition from Part C to Part B.
