A program serving Defiance, Erie, Fulton, Lucas, Henry, Ottawa, Sandusky, Williams and Wood counties supported by a grant from The Ohio Department of Health facilitated by Flower Hospital. When parents and families discover their infant or toddler has a hearing loss, they need to know where to turn for help.

REACH is a FREE program that works with other existing programs to see that families get all the help they need. By working together, we ensure that families with infants who are deaf or hard-of-hearing, who have received a cochlear implants, or who have a hearing loss due to chronic ear infections receive the information and help they need to understand their child's hearing loss. Getting help early is important.

REACH provides families with the ongoing support of an outreach coordinator who is an early intervention specialist experienced in working with deaf and hard-of-hearing infants.

This support includes:

- Home visits as needed
- Information about the wide variety of options available
- Regular progress checks
- Suggestions for building communication and language
- Information about child development
- Links to audiology, speech therapy, and family support services

Helps you to develop ongoing partnerships with community resources.

Challenges you to recognize your child's and family's strengths.

Explores with you all the possibilities.
