Information and outreach services, at no cost, for families of infants and toddlers (birth to 3 years of age) who are Deaf and Hard of Hearing

ELIGIBILTY

Families with an infant or toddler who is Deaf or Hard of Hearing and reside in one of the following counties: Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway, or Union

COMPONENTS OF THE PROGRAM

- Provide information regarding the impact that being deaf or hard-of-hearing has on speech and language developmentt
- Provide information regarding hearing aids, cochlear implants, and communication options
- Develop strategies to promote auditory and communication skills
- Provide links to community resources and additional service providers









SERVICES AVAILABLE

- Home visits from a teacher of the Deaf and a Speech Language Pathologist, who are SKI·HI certified
- Parent Support Group/Toddler Group
- Audiological Consultation
- Home visits from a Deaf mentor.

PROGRAM STAFF

- Teacher of the Deaf to provide families with unbiased information regarding hearing loss and communication issues, as well as direct intervention strategies to promote auditory, language, and cognitive development.
- Speech Language Pathologist to provide families with direct intervention strategies for the development of their childrens' speech and language skills.
- Audiologist to provide ongoing monitoring of hearing levels and to evaluate the functioning and benefit of amplification systems.
- Deaf Mentor to provide information regarding Deaf culture and opportunities to interact with the Deaf community.
