If so... the Regional Infant Hearing Program can help!

What is the Regional Infant Hearing Program?

The purpose of the Regional Infant Hearing Program (RIHP) is to educate families about their child's hearing loss, the options they have regarding the hearing loss, and steps to take to help their infant/ toddler communicate effectively. The Regional Infant Hearing Program is funded by the Ohio Department of Health and is a program of the Community Action Commission of Belmont.



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How much do services cost?

Services are provided in your home or at any location that is convenient for you. There is NO COST to the families enrolled in the program.

How do I know if I am eliqible for RIHP?

If you are a resident of any of the following counties: Belmont, Carroll. Coshocton, Guernsey, Harrison, Holmes. Jefferson, Monroe. Morgan, Muskingum. Noble, Perry, or Tuscarawas, and if you have a child age zero to three who has a diagnosed hearing loss, you are eligible for services.
